2010 Player Registration Information Package



NOTE: Please read attached information carefully, as some information pertaining to the Mooredale Soccer Club is new in 2010!

Mooredale prides itself on offering its Soccer program as a non-competitive sports league to its members. The **real essence** of the Mooredale Soccer Club is that everyone who registers gets to play on a team in a recreational environment where winning is second to having fun with friends while improving your game.

2010 Teammate Request Policy: In 2010 Mooredale will be implementing a 'new' teammate request policy. Mooredale will make every effort to accommodate placement on a team with one other registered player, if requested at the time of registration. This request must be made in writing, in the space provided on the registration form. Requests will not be accepted over the phone, via e-mail, or on a separate form. Mooredale would prefer, but not require, that this be a reciprocal request (Player A requests Player B and Player B requests Player A). Mooredale will not guarantee requests, particularly if a "chain" is requested.



Mooredale S.C.: Turf Field Fee: The Mooredale Soccer Club established a capital fund to create an all-weather soccer turf field near our community in the future. To that end, the soccer club has added a \$5.00 surcharge to every soccer registration in 2010 towards the building of the turf field. The Mooredale Soccer Club operates two days per week in each division (except U4 Development), with one hour per week being a week-day evening practice, and another hour on Saturday devoted to game play (Sunday for U17 Mixed games). The season is scheduled to run from the week of May 1 until June 19 and will resume the week of September 6 and end on October 2. Players are encouraged to participate in both hours of the program – as Mooredale is a developmental league, and the majority of skill development occurs with practice.

During the 2010 Outdoor Season, Mooredale Soccer will be operating the following Mixed (boys/girls) divisions:

U4 (2006) Development: A developmental program for children that turn 4 years old in 2010. The program **runs 6 sessions during the Spring Session of Mooredale Soccer (May 1 to June 19)**, and consists of development drills instructed by our trained student leaders and under the guidance of our technical advisor. The location of this program is Rosedale Park.

U5 (2005) Mixed: The U5 Mixed program is, for most of our participants, an introduction to organized soccer. Running for 10 weeks (May, June, September) the focus is on fun, and basic technical skills. All games and practices take place at Rosedale Park.

U6 (2004) Mixed: The U6 Mixed program is a non-competitive division where focus remains on the 'fun' fundamentals, and having fun. Running for 10 weeks (May, June, September) all of the games and practices in this division take place at Rosedale Park.

U7 (2003) Mixed: The U7 Mixed program is the transition year from micro soccer, to mini soccer as the field size and goal size increases from the U6 program. The focus remains on fun and skill improvement, and game results are not kept or tracked. Running for 10 weeks (May, June, and September) all of the games and practices in this division take place at Rosedale Park.

U8 (2002) Mixed: The U8 division is the first year of 'Mini Soccer' played on a larger field, and with larger nets than in U7. The U8 games are refereed by certified referees, game results are kept, standings tracked, and a play-off tournament is played during the last three weeks of the season. All games and practices over the 10 week season (May, June and September) take place at Rosedale Park.

U10 (2001, 2000) Mixed: The U10 division will play on a mini field at Rosedale Park and practice weekly at Rosedale Park. This division will continue to focus on skill development, but will begin the process of developing tactical knowledge in preparation for the graduation to 11 a-side soccer. All games are refereed by certified referees, game results kept, standings tracked, and play-off games are played over the last three weeks of the season.

U12 (1999, 1998) Mixed: The U12 division shifts to a full size (11 a-side) field at Riverdale East Park for games. During the one hour practice session held at Rosedale Park the focus will remain on technical improvement, tactical knowledge, and having fun. Scores and standings are recorded, games are refereed by a certified referee, and play-offs are played during the last three weeks of the season.

U14 (1997, 1996) Mixed: Open to males and females the U14 division plays its games at Riverdale Park, and practices are held weekly at Rosedale Park. Tactical knowledge, positional play, and technical advancement are the focuses of this division. Scores and standings are recorded, games are refereed by a certified referee, and play-offs are played during the last three weeks of the season.

U17 (1995, 1994, 1993) Mixed: Open to males and females the U17 division shifts back to Rosedale Park to play on the full size field. The games in the U17 Mixed Division are played on Sunday afternoon. The U17 division will have one optional practice per week, supervised by coaches, in which the players will be split into informal teams and will scrimmage on the full field at Rosedale Park. Scores and standings are recorded, during regular season play, games are refereed by a certified referee, and play-offs are played during the last three weeks of the season.

During the 2010 Outdoor Season, Mooredale Soccer will be operating the following All-Girls Divisions:

U8 (2003, 2002) Girls: The U8 division is the first year of ‘Mini Soccer’ played on a larger field, and with larger nets than in U7/U6. The U8 games are refereed by certified referees, game results are kept, standings tracked, and a play-off tournament is played during the last three weeks of the season. All games and practices over the 10 week season (May, June and September) take place at Rosedale Park.

U10 (2001, 2000) Girls: The U10 division will play on a mini field at Rosedale Park and practice weekly at Rosedale Park. This division will continue to focus on skill development, but will begin the process of developing tactical knowledge in preparation for the graduation to 11 a-side soccer. All games are refereed by certified referees, game results kept, standings tracked, and play-off games are played over the last three weeks of the season.

U12 (1999, 1998) Girls: The U12 division shifts to a full size (11 a-side) field at Riverdale East Park for games. During the one hour practice session held at Rosedale Park the focus will remain on technical improvement, tactical knowledge, and having fun. Scores and standings are recorded, games are refereed by a certified referee, and play-offs are played during the last three weeks of the season.

U14 (1997, 1996) Girls: The U14 division plays its games at Riverdale Park, and practices are held weekly at Rosedale Park. Tactical knowledge, positional play, and technical advancement are the focuses of this division. Scores and standings are recorded, games are refereed by a certified referee, and play-offs are played during the last three weeks of the season.



U17(1995, 1994, 1993) Girls: The U17 Girls plays its games at Riverdale Park East, and will have an optional practice, supervised by coaches, weekly at Rosedale Park. At practice the players will be split into informal teams and will scrimmage for the entire hour of field time. Scores and standings are recorded, during regular season play, games are refereed by a certified referee, and play-offs are played during the last three weeks of the season.

Mooredale Soccer Expectations for a Great Season

Mooredale Soccer:

Will provide a recreational soccer program that is free of discrimination, encourages self-development and growth while building on the foundations of good sportsmanship, Fair Play, and FUN! To maintain an environment that is conducive to meeting our goals we insist everyone involved in the program play their part.

From our Coaches we Expect:

- Inclusiveness where everyone is encouraged and praised for taking part in practices and games and everyone receives equal playing time.
- Consistent and effective communication to keep everyone up to date on all aspects of the soccer program.
- A commitment to improve the performance of the players on the team both physically and mentally.
- A respect to be shown to all human beings. Opponents and officials must be treated with respect.
- An enthusiastic and positive approach to games and practices to ensure that they are generous with their praise when deserved.
- A maintenance of high standards regarding personal conduct and fair play.

From Our Players We Expect:

- Maximum effort to strive for their best performance during games and practice sessions.
- A display of good sportsmanship to set a positive example for others, particularly younger players and supporters.
- Acceptance of success and failure, victory and defeat equally, and to treat opponents with respect at all times.
- That players accept the decision of the game official without protest and to show respect towards all game officials.
- That players abide by the instructions of his/her coach and team volunteers, provided they do not contradict the spirit of this code.
- That players arrive on time for all games or practice, or notify the coach in advance, for any activity for which the player will be late or absent.
- That players show respect for the facilities and equipment that is used.

From Our Parents We Expect:

- That parents must inform the coach, as far in advance as possible, if the player will not be available for a practice session or game.
- That parents must inform the coach of any illness or ailment that may affect the performance or health of the player.
- That parents must always encourage ALL players during the game regardless of the result of the game.
- That parents shall not give instructions to the players during the game or at half time, unless requested (or okayed) by the coach.
- That parents must be courteous and polite at all time towards opponents, coaches, managers, referees, and officials.
- That parents shall feel free to approach the coach to discuss any aspect of the player’s soccer development.
- That parents who drive players to soccer will use legal parking areas only.
