



## **Re: Paid and Volunteer Opportunities available with the Mooredale S.C. in 2010**

With the 2010 soccer season fast approaching, and the end of the school year winding to its conclusion it feels like an appropriate time to outline some of the opportunities that are available with the Mooredale S.C. in the upcoming season.

### **U4 Development Coach/Student Mentor**

In 2010 we will be continuing on with our successful 'mentorship' program, which was introduced in 2008. A mentor will be provided with 'coach' training and then assigned to teams that do not have an experienced 'adult' coach to become part of that team's coaching staff. This will require the commitment of a regular coach – which is 1 hour of practice a week, 1 hour of game per week, plus administrative tasks (communicating with parents, planning practices, arriving early for games, etc ...). This will be a paid position in 2010, provided that all criteria are met during the course of the season. Further, many of our mentors will be utilized in Mooredale's U4 Development program – and will work under the guidance of our technical advisor running the U4 Development program. ### **Soccer Referee**

The Mooredale S.C. is also looking for game officials (referees) for the 2010 season. If you are interested in becoming a Mooredale referee for this season you should forward a letter of interest, and a résumé to [smcketsy@mooredale.on.ca](mailto:smcketsy@mooredale.on.ca). If you are selected to be an official with Mooredale you will be required to attend referee training, held at Mooredale in early April.

### **Park Supervisors/Monitors**

We are also looking for park monitors to help with field set-up and take down at both Rosedale Park and Riverdale Park on Saturdays during soccer season. . This will be a paid position, and ideally will be for all 12 weeks of the soccer season (May, June, and September). The park monitor at Riverdale Park will be required to transport the soccer netting, put the nets up, and take the nets down every Saturday. Therefore the monitors will need the use of a vehicle, or live within walking distance of the Park. ### **Volunteer Opportunities (Assistant Coaches) – Community Service Hours**
